The important vote for all MPs on the assisted suicide legislation, known as the *Terminally III Adults* (*End of Life*) *Bill*, is likely to take place on 25<sup>th</sup> April. The charity Right to Life UK has a simple online mechanism to allow people to contact their Member of Parliament and it only takes a few moments to submit a message to ask an MP to stop assisted suicide being rushed into law. Right to Life is also distributing postcards to parishes for parishioners to send to their MPs on this subject.
